# **On-going Business**

- DORA: Geo Rocco, City of Cincinnati Economic Development. Desigated Outdoor Beverage Area (DORA). If you have a liquor license you can sell liquor and patrons can walk around the district with their drink. Other neighborhoods who are a DORA district and it is going well. The city has to approve the designation. The designation would be active for five year and then is up for renewal. Hours of operation Mon-Fri, 5-11, Sat-Sun, 12-11. The hours of operation will be flexible. The boundaries will be on the cup so the customer will know where they are allowed to wander. Management would run through CHRCUR. New employees will maintain picking up litter. Cups are sold at hirer rate to have additional funds to hire police or other mainteance people. The boundaries will be desigated marked on sidewalks. A customer can purchase a drink and go to another busines who does not have a license. Karen wants to know if the district will need special insurance policy—Geo is not sure. Ron wants to know how many cups one person can purchase. Terry hopes there will be more trash cans. Department of Sanitation has surveyed the avenue and is deciding where to place more cans. Seth says that if DORA is not working we will scale it back or disolve it. Tina motions to vote in favor of DORA licensing with CHCURC administering. Nine in favor and one abstainined.
